Open Budget Survey


- The OBS 2021 is the only comparable and independent measure of budget transparency, participation, and oversight in the world
- OBS 2021 covers 120 countries
- The survey uses a questionnaire with 145 scored indicators drawn from international good practices and standards
- In most countries, survey research is conducted by local civil society researchers
- Questionnaires are peer reviewed, and governments are invited to comment on the draft results

What's new with the OBS 2021?

- Release of the OBS COVID module in April 2021
- More digital-friendly global report and 7 regional briefs
- Greater collaboration with OBS partners
- Increased emphasis on public participation
- More intensive engagement at the national level




Changes in transparency, public participation, and oversight from OBS 2019 to OBS 2021

- Increased representation from marginalized communities in budget consultations (South Korea)




No country meets minimum standards for adequate accountability on all three measures

Budgets in most countries are not sufficiently transparent.


