- Results & training presentations to key stakeholders









Current projects: El Salvador

- Since 2023, with GIZ & European Union in promoting more open, inclusive & green PFM in El Salvador
- Significant progress made in review of fiscal openness landscape & drafting improvement recommendations, including for Open data, website design, citizen friendly budget documents & public participation
- Successful in-country missions, including in June 2024 where Cooperation Agreement was signed between Ministry of Finance & European Union on fiscal transparency

- Based on GIFT Transparency Principles for Tax Policy and Administration & Making Tax Work: A Framework for Enhancing Tax Transparency






Current projects: Ghana
